In 2023, we continued to live into a team based ministry structure. Our goal was to help all of our teams grow spiritual leadership to serve their particular area of ministry. All of our teams support the mission and vision of the church.

Our Administrative Teams are SPPRC, Finance and Trustees. Each of these areas work to support the mission and vision of Fulton First UMC. By supporting and supervising staff, overseeing the financial resources available, and maintaining the facilities and equipment our administrative teams are the foundation of our mission. Their work enables the work of every one of our ministry teams.

Our Ministry Teams are Congregational Care, Discipleship, Mission and Outreach, and Worship. Each of these teams has a specific role in our ministry, but all work together to ensure we are always reaching out to others and providing care for one another.

The narrative budget will help you see how our tithes and offerings are used by our teams to support our mission. Our goal for Fulton First UMC is to be good stewards of our dollars so that everything helps us live into the vision of a community of growing disciples.

The Church Council

The Church Council is the legislative team that oversees all of the business of the Church. The Church Council meets to approve the overall budget of the church, and to support the recommendations from the administrative and ministry teams. It is the only body within the church that can vote in changes to items previously approved for Charge Conference. It meets several times a year as needed and always to approve materials for the Charge Conference in the fall. All are welcome to come.

The staff and pastors are present for council meetings without vote. Robert Rushing serves as our lay leader and Annual Conference representative. The Operations Team works hard to be open to the leadership of the Holy Spirit and is committed to growing as disciples themselves, and helping others grow strong in faith.

Total Budget for 2024 - \$505,456

Finance:

The Finance Team has begun an overhaul of the budgeting and financial structure of the church. In 2024 they will continue to develop a budget based upon projected income and missionally aligned needs/request submitted from each Ministry Team and, keep teams appraised of expenditures vs budget.

They will seek and implement new and creative means for improving revenue streams and for effectively informing our congregation of progress.

They will insure that all special monetary gifts (and restricted funds) are accepted and used directly in line with our mission.

They will work cooperatively with the Trustees to undertake a thorough review of our church's insurance coverage and costs and determine appropriateness or needs for change.

They will develop a proposal for conducting a multi-pronged capital campaign for funding large capital improvements and other unexpected expenditure needs.

Ministry Teams

We have four ministry teams that work together, along with our Administrative Teams, to ensure we live into our mission, vision, and values. Each team has its own area of responsibility and also works cooperatively to ensure we are making good use of our resources and faithfully serving God, and our community, and growing spiritually.

Our ministry teams are the Discipleship Team, the Worship Team, the Congregational Care Team and the Mission and Outreach Team. Each of these teams, along with the Administrative Teams serve on





the Operations Team, which meets most months, and their own teams that meet as necessary.

Each team is asked to use the Three L outline: time set apart at each meeting to Love, Learn, and Lead. Loving time is spent in fellowship, growing closer to God and each other as we share our stories. Learning time is where we share resources, studies, and other educational material that help us serve more effectively in our ministry area. Leading time is set aside to decide how we will apply the learning information to faithful service.

Discipleship Team \$ 106,268

The Discipleship Team's key area of responsibility is to ensure that we have opportunities for each age level in our church to grow as disciples of Jesus. We do this through Sunday School classes, Children and Youth opportunities, small group Bible studies, and short term studies. The Discipleship Team looks at the existing learning opportunities and responds to the needs of our growing church.

Their work is important to the spiritual life of our congregation. They help us fill in the gaps for areas that need different resources and look for individuals who may be called to teach or facilitate small groups.



Mission and Outreach \$125,828

Mission and Outreach had an amazing year in 2023! With much help from other teams and church members, we hosted 2 concerts and 9 mission teams made up of 133 volunteers. Our church handed out

600 bottles of free water at the Banana Festival, opened a cooling center during the hottest days of summer, coordinated the Angel Tree to provide Christmas for 30 children. Teaming up with the Congregational Care team, we fed tacos to 110 Railroaders and church members, and helped with the Easter Egg Hunt. With the Food Bank, we planned, assembled, and handed out 300 Thanksgiving Boxes. With multiple other teams, we helped to pull together our annual Halloween at the parsonage.

We will soon start planning activities for 2024. Priorities for 2024 will be to find even more outreach opportunities, provide volunteer and service opportunities for all church members and more and better communication.
